

Directions to Redwood Glen:

Please Note: There are two camps named Redwood Glen! One is owned by the Salvation Army, located in Scotts Valley/Santa Cruz. These are NOT the directions to the Salvation Army's Redwood Glen. These are for Redwood Glen in Loma Mar, CA located about 30 minutes South of Half Moon Bay and about 60 minutes North of Santa Cruz.

It's easy to get to Redwood Glen!:

- 1) Hop on Highway 92 West all the way to Half Moon Bay and
- 2) turn left onto Highway 1 South.
- 3) Travel 15 scenic miles and
- 4) take a left on Pescadero Creek Road.
- 5) 10 more miles and you'll see signs for Redwood Glen on your right.

In additional detail:

From the Bay or East Bay Area head South on either 880, 280, or 101 to Highway 92 West.

From the South Bay Area head North on 880, 280, or 101 to Highway 92 West.

Once on 92 West travel 7 miles beyond 280 to Half Moon Bay (1). 92 West will 'T' into Highway 1 at a stop light with an Alliance Gas Station on your right and Burger King in front of you. Turn left off of 92 onto Highway 1 South (2).

From San Francisco you can also just take Highway 1 South all the way to get to Half Moon Bay. Proceed 15.5 miles past Half Moon Bay on Highway 1 South (3) and turn left onto Pescadero Creek Road (4).

From Santa Cruz simply take Highway 1 North about 31 miles from the edge of town and turn right onto Pescadero Creek Road.

Travel 9.7 miles on Pescadero Creek Road through the towns of Pescadero, and the very tiny Loma Mar, and past San Mateo County Memorial Park (5). You'll see the signs for Redwood Glen just a quarter mile past the main entrance for Memorial Park on your right. Note: If you see the first entrance for Wurr Road just a couple hundred feet after the Loma Mar Store do not turn onto it, but continue on Pescadero Creek Road 1.6 miles past Loma Mar until you pass Memorial Park and then see the signs for Redwood Glen on your right.

Alternative Route:

Most of our guests find they prefer the above routes, along the scenic coast and Highway 1, for their beauty, simplicity, and relatively less windy roads. However, if you are traveling from Redwood City or further South, like San Jose, there is an alternate route that can save around 20-30 minutes on your drive, if you are intuitive with directions and don't mind more windy roads. You can take Highway 84 West from either 101 or 280. Highway 84 is Woodside Road through the town of Woodside and then becomes La Honda Road through the town of La Honda. You'll wind your way up 84 West 6.5 miles past 280 through Woodside to the intersection of 84 and Highway 35 Skyline Blvd. Gas pumps on your right and Alice's Restaurant ahead to the right. This is a slightly X shaped intersection but you simply want to cross Highway 35 Skyline Blvd and continue on Highway 84 which is now La Honda Road passing just to the left of Alice's Restaurant. From this intersection you'll proceed 6 miles to the town of La Honda. Proceed through La Honda and just about a half mile past the edge of town take a left on Pescadero Road. From here you are just winding another 5.3 miles to Redwood Glen, but note, after just over one mile Pescadero Road makes a very sharp hairpin turn to the right where Alpine Road shoots off straight, or left, of sorts. Stay on Pescadero Road, taking that first hairpin turn, and continue to wind up the hill then down, then past YMCA Camp Jones Gulch and then past YMCA Camp Loma Mar. Less than 300 feet past YMCA Camp Loma Mar you'll see the signs for Redwood Glen on the left.
